

## USD 347 Enrollment & Projection & Nonresident Enrollment Report

Per K.S.A [72-3123](#), [72-3124](#), and [72-3126](#), before May 1st of each year, the superintendent of schools or designee will develop and submit a recommendation to the board of education declaring the projected enrollment and number of open seats available to nonresident students. By June 1 of each year, the district will publish on its website, at a minimum, the number of students expected to attend the district in the next school year and the number of open seats available to nonresident students. Included in this report are recommended actions the board of education is asked to take to fulfill such a statutory requirement.

### **Enrollment Projection Determination**

Outlined in this report is a collection of data and considerations used to prepare a recommendation to the board of education to approve enrollment projections and the number of seats available to nonresident students.

### **Nonresident Student Enrollment Capacity**

USD #347 will have limited capacity to accept nonresident students for the 2024-2025 school year. Based on the projected enrollment and capacity to operate effectively, USD #347 will accept nonresident students as outlined in the table below. The district reserves the right to assign nonresident students to a school and the process for selection is outlined below. Students living outside of the USD #347 boundary must formally apply for nonresident enrollment and use the application linked below which will be available on or before June 1, 2024. The completed application must be received by no later than June 30, 2024. Applications may also be picked up and returned to the USD #347 District Office at 120 W. 8th in Kinsley. ### **Selection Process**

by May 1      District capacity determined  
by June 1      District capacity posted on website  
June 1-30      Nonresident Application Forms made available and accepted

Between July 1st and July 15th of each year:

1. The superintendent or representative will sort and select nonresident student applications that match the approved and published nonresident student enrollment available in the district.

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2. The superintendent or representative will ensure that all eligible nonresident student applications are included in the lottery selection process.
3. The names of each nonresident applicant will be entered into the lottery and selected randomly by grade level.
4. All students entered into the lottery *shall* be drawn and listed in order of selection.
5. The superintendent or designee will review and confirm each student drawn qualifies for nonresident enrollment.
6. Each student selected for enrollment will be assigned to a school as determined by the superintendent or designee.
7. The parent or guardian of each student selected for enrollment will be notified of their acceptance as nonresident students and of the school placement.
8. The parent or guardian *must* acknowledge receipt of acceptance and student placement within *five (5)* business days from the date of notification or the nonresident enrollment will be denied.
9. The superintendent or designee will confirm that nonresident students have filled all approved open seats until the applicant list for each grade level is exhausted.
10. Applicants not selected for nonresident enrollment will be notified and provided the reason for non-selection.
11. The district *may* maintain a “waiting list” of nonresident students who were not selected for enrollment but may be eligible for a seat if one becomes available.
